POLICIES FOR MASTER'S DEGREE PROGRAM

ADMISSION POLICIES

I. GENERAL

1. For admission into the graduate program in the College of Engineering Sciences, Technology and Agriculture (CESTA) at Florida A&M University, and the Department of Entomology and Nematology at the University of Florida, an applicant must:
 - a. Have a baccalaureate or a master's degree in a related field from an accredited college or university;
 - b. Be in good standing in the institution of higher learning last attended;
 - c. Present a copy of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) taken within the last two years with a minimum score of 1000 on the combined verbal and quantitative portions of the aptitude test of the GRE, and at least a GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) on the last two years of study for the baccalaureate degree.
 - d. Have at least a GPA of 3.0 on all graduate work.
 - e. Present three letters of recommendations. At least one letter should be related to the academic readiness of the student.
 - f. Submit a one-page personal statement, discussing the student's desire for a graduate degree.
 - g. Be approved by CESTA's Graduate Admissions Committee, and by the Dean. Admission is dependent upon the availability of an appropriate advisor.
 - h. Be approved by the University of Florida Graduate Admissions Committee, and by the Dean
2. **International Students:** In addition to the requirements listed above, a score of 550 or better on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) is required for international students whose native language is not English. Students are required to purchase U.S. health insurance while at the university.
